EMERGENCY PREPARDNESS & EVACUATION PLAN FOR PARK

EVACUATION ORDERS

Police, Fire or other City, State or government agency may order you to evacuate. In the event that Butte City Hunting Club, Inc. is notified or sees it necessary to evacuate all or any portion of the park, we will go door to door and ask you to evacuate. In the event of a natural disaster, TV news or your radio may be the best source for information on evacuation needs.

You are responsible for preparing and evacuating yourselves .Butte City Hunting Club, Inc. does not provide any materials, services, or transportation during an emergency evacuation.

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Cal EMA – Emergency Plan

Assembly Area: In front of club house

Emergency Shelter: Bunk House, Club House and Large Barn

Fire extinguishers are located in the Bunk House and the Club House. Each trailer owner is encouraged to keep a fire extinguisher in his/her trailer.

There is only one entrance and exit to our trailer compound available during the operation of our trailer parking permit, which is October 15th thru February 28th. This is a maintained dirt road which runs 0.5 miles in an east/west direction from County Road Z to our Club House. This is designated as our primary evacuation route.

There is no two way traffic throughout the trailer parking area.

There are no fixed obstacles in the trailer parking area which would hinder the primary evacuation route.

If the primary evacuation route is blocked, there are three alternative evacuation routes available:

- 1) A dirt road running north from the Club House 0.5 miles to County Road Z;
- 2) A dirt road running west from the Club House 2.5 miles to County Road Y; and
- 3) A dirt road running south from the Club House 1.0 miles to County Road Z.

In the event that all evacuation routes are unavailable, the open field adjacent to the easternmost boundary of our trailer parking area can be used for air lift rescue.

The trailer parking compound is more than seven feet above flood plain. Therefore, there is no need to plan for nor prepare for air lift procedures from any roof tops.

There are four major cities to evacuate to in case of an emergency:

- 1) Willows; proceed east from the compound 0.5 miles to County Road Z, then south on County Road Z 2 miles to Hwy 162, then west on Hwy 162 4 miles to Hwy 45, then north on Hwy 45 7 miles to Willows;

- 2) Chico; proceed east from the compound 0.5 miles to County Road Z, then north on County Road Z 10 miles to Ord Ferry Road, then east on Ord Ferry Road 5 miles to Agus Frias Road, then north on Agus Frias Road 8 miles to Chico;
- 3) Colusa; proceed east from the compound 0.5 miles to County Road Z, then south on County Road Z 2 miles to Hwy 162, then west on Hwy 162 4 miles to Hwy 45, then south on Hwy 45 20 miles to Colusa;
- 4) Oroville; proceed east from the compound 0.5 miles to County Road Z, then south on County Road Z 2 miles to Hwy 162, then east on Hwy 162 13 miles to Hwy 99, then north on Hwy 99 4 miles to Oroville Dam Road, then east 6 miles on Oroville Dam Road to Oroville.

A map showing the routes to the above destinations is attached at to this document.

Safety issues regarding the personal travel trailers parked in our compound during duck hunting season are all common sense. There are no hookups allowed, so issues regarding water and electricity do not apply. However, generators are allowed, so storage of gasoline must be considered. Also, LP gas tanks on each trailer should be turned off when to owner/occupant leaves his/her trailer for any extended period.

The greatest chance of anything that could be considered a potential emergency disaster in our area is flooding. As our permit of operation is for only 4½ months per years, and the timing of the permit is during the winter, water is the only act of nature that threatens our compound. Should you be concerned about flooding, you can check river and creek levels on radio channel KPAY 1290 AM. Also, you can watch the local news on your television, or in the club house. Should you need to contact any emergency service, below are the necessary telephone numbers:

Emergency response plan notification process:

BCHC operates under a limited occupancy permit. BCHC trailer parking rules requires each trailer owner to notify our club manager upon arrival, and supply the club with proof of insurance. At this time BCHC will advise each trailer owner of the emergency response plan. Each trailer owner will be given a copy of the plan, and will sign a document that it was received. Additional copies of the plan will be maintained by the club manager who is a full time on site resident, along with the club secretary. The club maintains a clubhouse with a bulletin board which will also have a full plan copy available. We will also post a copy of the plan on our website.
